We hosted Ms. Bear's high school science class and Kindergarten to Grades 1, 2, 4, and 5. They got to see the main Greenhouse and the newest Greenhouse. The students also had the chance to go into the growcer to see where our lettuce is grown in our hydroponic unit.

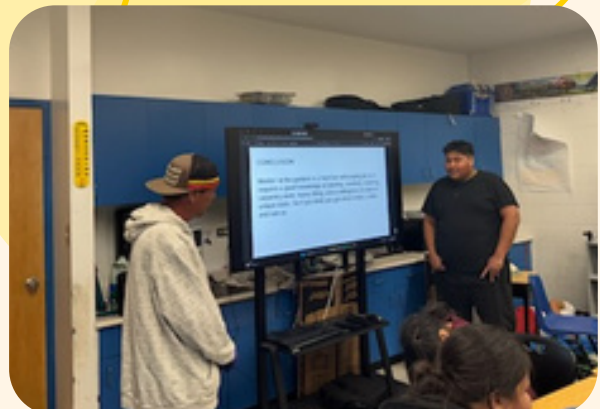
APR 21 Presentations at the school

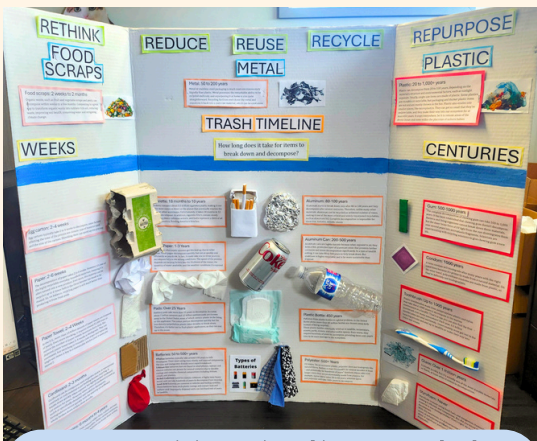

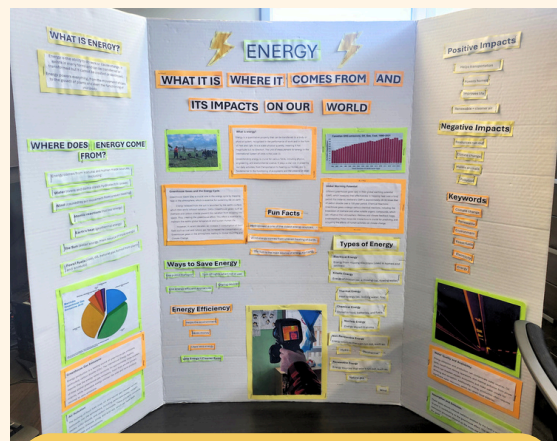
A conventional microwave oven uses more electricity to allow the digital clock to work continuously than heating your food.

The Gardens team recently hired 4 youth workers and 3 new seasonal workers until harvest time!

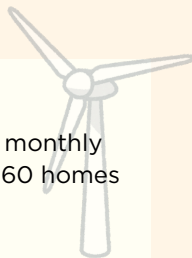
The Garden's team is about to start planting outdoors after the May long weekend. Tobacco, pshdyapi, a variety of vegetables and native wildflowers & grasses.

Updates With The Lands Projects



Mni Wiconi - Water is Life



Mni Wiconi is an environmental water quality project working to understand the health of the Assiniboine River and its tributaries within SVDN.

Last fall, with the help of the Lands Youth Council, we collected 120 water samples and analyzed them for 28 heavy metals, mercury, as well as pesticides and fertilizers levels.

This spring, sampling continues so we can compare seasons and see how planting and harvesting cycles affect water quality.

Flood Mapping in SVDN

This spring has brought significant flooding to Sioux Valley Dakota Nation, and a new project is underway in partnership with CIRNAC to better understand and prepare for future events.

Using LiDAR-equipped drones, the community will be mapped in detail to build hydrologic and hydraulic models as well as elevation maps that support land use planning and community safety.



What has the Land Department been up to in recent months?



Direct Install Kits

We had the opportunity to work with Efficiency Manitoba, and we received Direct Install Kits. The kits included LED lightbulbs, low-flow shower heads, weather stripping and more.

We went to houses that signed up with us and installed the easy fixes, improving the houses' energy efficiency in our reserve!



Building Assessments and Energy Audits

We started working on building assessments of this year. We chose community buildings in our reserve and assessed any cold spots or where heat is collecting with a thermal camera.

After our first visit, we came back and made notes of all the objects that use energy so we know where the energy is being used and wasted.

We then make an audit report that focuses on suggestions on how to reduce energy in a building and make it more efficient.

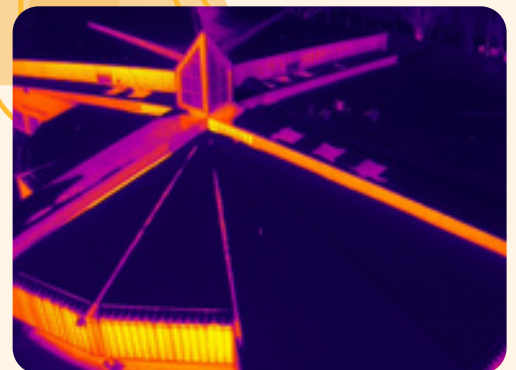

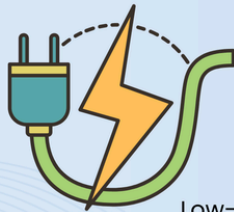


Attention On – Reserve Members:

- Clean countertops
- Wipe down cabinets and drawers
- Clean sink and faucet
- Stove: clean top, front, and inside
- Oven: clean inside and outside
- Microwave: clean inside and outside
- Refrigerator: clean outside and inside
- Dishwasher: clean outside and inside
- Sweep and mop floor

LIVING ROOM

- Dust surfaces (tables, shelves, etc.)
- Vacuum or sweep floors
- Clean windowsills
- Dust blinds or curtains
- Dust light fixtures
- Clean baseboards
- Vacuum upholstery (sofas, chairs)
- Clean ceiling fans
- Fluff and arrange cushions

BATHROOM

- Clean toilets (including bowl, seat and base)
- Scrub shower/tub (including tiles, grout, and showerhead)
- Clean sink and faucet
- Wipe down mirrors
- Clean light fixtures
- Clean counters, cabinets
