Employment Opportunity Jordan's Principle Child & Youth Counsellor Full-time

About the Role: We are seeking a compassionate and dedicated **Child & Youth Counsellor** to support children and youth through the Jordan's Principle Program at Sioux Valley Dakota Nation. This role provides supportive, non-clinical counselling, mentorship, and skill-building services to help children strengthen emotional regulation, confidence, relationships, and coping skills. Services are delivered in a culturally safe, trauma-informed, and strengths-based manner that reflects Dakota values and community wellness approaches

Key Responsibilities:

- Provide one-on-one supportive counselling and mentorship to children and youth.
- Support emotional regulation, self-esteem, stress management, social skills, and problem-solving.
- Deliver culturally safe, trauma-informed, and strengths-based support.
- Plan and facilitate group programs such as life-skills groups, peer-support circles, and cultural activities.
- Support land-based, recreational, and community wellness programming.
- Work collaboratively with families, schools, clinicians, and community partners.
- Assist in implementing therapeutic recommendations from Clinical Counsellors, SLPs, OTs, or other professionals.
- Participate in case meetings and contribute observations to support planning.
- Provide calm, supportive intervention during emotional or behavioural distress.
- De-escalate challenging situations using non-violent and trauma-informed strategies.
- Maintain session notes, attendance logs, and required documentation.
- Assist with data collection for Jordan's Principle reporting requirements.

Qualifications:

- Diploma or degree in Child & Youth Care, Social Work, Counselling, Psychology, or a related field.
- Experience working with children and youth in a supportive or mentorship role required.
- Experience working in a First Nations or community-based setting is an asset.
- Strong rapport-building and communication skills.
- Knowledge of trauma-informed practice and child development.
- Ability to plan and facilitate group activities and youth programming.
- Cultural humility and understanding of Indigenous wellness approaches.
